

**PUBLIC NOTICE
NOTICE OF ACQUIRING
BURIAL PLOTS**

TO:

You are hereby given notice that only a portion of the hereinafter described burial plots conveyed by the City of Montevideo to the party indicated by the hereinafter described burial plots have been used for burial purposes for more than forty (40) years and that title to these unused burial plots will revert in the City of Montevideo unless within thirty (30) days from the service of this Notice, as provided in Chapter 47 of the Session laws of the State of Minnesota for 1967, a written statement by the owner of such burial plots, or someone on his behalf, is filed with the City of Montevideo stating that it is in the intention of the owner to retain title to the burial plots.

Herbert A. Benham: All of Lot One (1), Block One (1) of the Sunset Memorial Cemetery of Montevideo, Minnesota, was conveyed by the City of Montevideo to Herbert A. Benham on February 12, 1920, and the last burial thereon was on April 10, 1944, and the unused portion of the said Lot One (1), Block One (1) which is to be acquired by the City of Montevideo is described as follows: The E1/2 and the S4' of the N8' of the W1/2 of said Lot One (1), all in Block One (1) of Sunset Memorial Cemetery of Montevideo, Minnesota. The record owner as of this time of the burial plots proposed to be reacquired by the City of Montevideo is Herbert Benham.

Hans A. Jacobsen: All of Lot Five (5), Block One (1) of the Sunset Memorial Cemetery of Montevideo, Minnesota, was conveyed by the City of Montevideo to Hans A.
